



Houston company AL-Razaq Computing Services wins Huntsville NASA contract worth up to \$99 million

HUNTSVILLE, Alabama - A Houston company has won a computer services support contract at NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville worth a potential \$99 million. AL-Razaq Computing Services was the winner beating out former contract holder Digital Fusions Solutions.

Al-Razaq, which is Arabic for "the provider," is a sole-source privately held company that also supports the NASA center in Houston, NASA's Ames Research Center in California and the U.S. Department of Commerce in Washington, a company spokesman said. The company has picked up the employees of the preceding contract holder, spokesman Richard Getteaux said.

The services include operational and administrative support to the Office of Procurement, the Office of the Chief Financial Officer and other Marshall Center offices and directorates. NASA said the contract begins April 1 with a one-year base period, followed by four one-year options. It is a firm-fixed price, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract with a minimum order quantity value of \$1 million each contract year. The maximum order quantity value is \$99 million, if all options are exercised.

Under the contract, Al-Razaq will also support NASA operations at the Michoud Assembly Facility near New Orleans and the National Space Science Technology Center in Huntsville.
